

When may cookies be sold?

Orders may be taken from **September 28th - October 18th**. Girls can continue to take orders using the Goal Getter Card starting October 19 until November 9, 2007.

**How much do the cookies cost?**

Girl Scouts of Greater Chicago & Northwest Indiana will be selling cookies for **\$4.00** per box.

Who can sell?

Any registered Girl Scout (except Daisy Girl Scouts) with no outstanding financial debts to the Council.

Participation is strictly voluntary.

When is money collected?

Money is collected when cookies are delivered. Your customers should make checks payable to Girl Scouts of Greater Chicago & Northwest Indiana or Girl Scouts. No personal checks over \$100.00.

When is money due?

Money is due to the Troop Cookie Manager no later than November 19, 2007. We encourage parents to turn in money frequently. Make sure to get receipt of any money turned in. Contact the Troop Cookie Manager for more details.

**What does the troop earn?**

All proceeds are based on the per girl average of the troop!

Level	Less than 125	125-175	175 or above
Brownie - Junior	65¢	70¢	75¢
Girl Scouts 11-17	70¢	75¢	80¢
Girl Scouts 11-17 choosing no incentives	75¢	80¢	85

What are booth sales?

Booth Sales are direct cookies sales where girls with adult supervision sell at approved locations. The troop will decide if they want to participate in booth sales. Booth sales dates are from October 26th - November 25th

How can you help?

- Make sure your Girl Scout is registered for the 2008 membership year. Read, sign and turn in the permission slip to your troop cookie manager prior to taking orders.
- Support your daughter's participation.
- Know important dates and stick to deadlines.
- Communicate with your daughter's Troop Leader and Troop Cookie Manager.
- Help your daughter set personal goals. Talk about them and keep things positive.

How can cookies be sold?

- Most Girl Scouts take orders in their immediate neighborhood, by going door-to-door. Your Troop Cookie Manager will review safety procedures.
- Help your daughter think of new places to go – a business, for example. Your daughter could contact a business owner for permission to sell cookies to employees.
- Many parents help by taking an order card to their work place. Encourage your daughter to write a note and attach it to the order card telling prospective customers what her troop plans to do with the money they earn.

Remember, Internet sales are **STRICTLY** prohibited by GSUSA; however, a girl may email friends and family reminding them that she is selling Girl Scout Cookies.


Why should my daughter participate in the Cookie Sale Program?



Participation gives your daughter the opportunity to develop an abundance of life skills by teaching her responsibility, communication, math skills, teamwork, and learning how to achieve goals she sets. It also raises funds for troop activities and Council programs and properties.
